

# "SPOT" COLOR

with Adobe® Photoshop®



## Step 1

- » Open the photo you want to work with and duplicate it in a new layer (Cmd/Ctrl + J or right-click and choose Duplicate Layer).

## Step 2

- » Select the area you want to be in color.  
*There are numerous ways to select a portion of a photo. The newest in Photoshop CS3 is the Quick Selection Tool (located under the Magic Wand Tool).*
- » Duplicate your selection in a new layer (Cmd/Ctrl + J or right-click and choose Layer Via Copy).

## Step 3

- » Select the layer with the original image and create a new black & white adjustment layer.
- » From the Layers panel, choose the half black/half white circle at the bottom and the choose Black & White. Choose the preset setting that looks best with your photo. Click OK.



## Step 4

- » Sometimes you may need to bump up the saturation of the color portion in order to make it pop.
- » Select the layer with the color image..
- » From the Layers panel, choose the half black/half white circle at the bottom and the choose Hue/Saturation. Move the Saturation slider to the right until the color pops, but is not distorted. Click OK.
